- 15 How did you and your family live during the war?
- 16 Where and how did you experience the end of the war?
- 17 Did you realize when hatred for Jews began to develop?

- 19 Did your parents vote for Hitler?
- 20 Was your father unemployed? If so, did that change when Hitler came to power?
