We, 11th grade students of the Wittenberge Comprehensive School, have started a history project. Our job is to research the Wittenberge branch of the concentration camp in Neuengamme, near Hamburg. But we're not only interested in history. We also want to find out more about the individual fates of the prisoners in Wittenberge. Up to now we have only death lists, and that is making our work very difficult. It would be much easier if we could speak with people who did not close their eyes to what was happening there as long as the camp facilities stood (1942 to February 1954). We'd also like to speak with those who realized that something strange was going on, since the prisoners murdered there could not simply have been buried on the rayon factory grounds. There must have been another burial place. Who helped the prisoners by sending them food? We need to contact people who lived in Wittenberge and surrounding areas when the camp was here. We would very much appreciate your help, because this too is a part of "Wittenberge history".
